Proposal preparation and funding (1)

- Double-application procedure: DAAD and Serbian Ministry of Education,
 Science, and Technological Development
- Joint development of the scientific part of the proposal in English, usually during mutual visits, Skype discussions, or over e-mail
- Each side then adapts the scientific part of the proposal to fit the required application form
 - Both project coordinators have to be committed to the project and ready to work technically on the proposal and to be involved in the application process
- Serbian side also needs to translate everything to Serbian, after the proposal is written in English – this has to be taken into account when planning application timeline
- Funding: Serbian side up to 3000 euros, German side up to 7000 euros per year; Project duration: 2 years
- Each side covers costs related to the visit and borne on its soil: ticket costs for project participants from its side, and per diem amounts for project participant from the other side

Proposal preparation and funding (2)

- Funding cannot be used for conferences, for material costs, etc.
- The assessment of proposals is independently done by DAAD and Serbian Ministry of Education, Science, and Technological Development
- Afterwards, bilateral committee makes the final joint ranking and a decision on funding
- The most important criteria are:
 - Quality of scientific proposal
 - Quality of the team, in particular project coordinators from both sides
 - Participation of young researchers
- Extreme flexibility of visits in the project framework once it is approved (from Serbian side the provisional schedule is not even required)

Best practices

- Projects should be reasonably sized:
 - one project coordinator and several PhD or master students;
 - one additional senior researcher might be an advantage, but the emphasis should be on collaboration through exchange of young researchers
- Complementarity aspects of collaboration should be emphasized
- For repeat offenders:
 - If applying in a new project cycle, the proposed research topics should be new and reasonably different from the old ones
 - The results of previously funded projects should be clearly mentioned,
 so as to stress that the collaboration was successful
